

The City of Millwood is undertaking a major review of the **Millwood Comprehensive Plan** and the development regulations which implement the plan, as required by the Washington State Growth Management Act. The City received a grant from the state to hire a consulting firm, Studio Cascade, Inc. of Spokane to perform the work. This is to comply with the state's mandate to review the comp plan to ensure that it still complies with GMA. An important part of the process is participation from you the public. There will be several opportunities throughout the process for public input, and I encourage you to get involved.

Also, the time for proposing amendments to the Comp Plan, the zoning code and other development regulations is approaching. The GMA limits amendments to not more often than once each year. We have set January as the month for the Planning Commission to consider amendments. Anyone interested in proposing amendments to the Comprehensive Plan or to any of the city codes related to the zoning, subdivision or environmental codes should contact the Planning Office before January 2, 2009.

This money will enable Millwood to add many of the features suggested in the Corridor project engineering report!
